Thor's Thoughts & Huk's Hints

Greetings!

Winter is a down time for most of us and it's also a good opportunity to check off some of those nagging but much needed house chores.

1. Weatherproof your windows

If you haven't done this one yet, then you're literally throwing money out the window. Most windows develop an air gap over time, which can cause as much as 40% energy loss for heating. Caulking that gap can make a big difference in your heating bills and comfort level."

2. Roof inspection

While you shouldn't go climbing up there when the weather is bad, it's a good idea to have someone inspect the roof on the next clear day, before another storm hits. Look for missing shingles and damage. Repair existing leaks to prevent large problems that can get expensive later. We recommend professional roof repairs and inspections by a professional. They will have the experience and knowledge necessary to identify and repair potential roofing problems.

3. Chimney care

If you use it, clean it. Creosote builds up on the chimney walls, and a stray spark could cause it to catch fire. Creosote is a black or brown residue that

forms on the inside of chimneys when heated by the fire. It's a messy job that requires very specific tools and should be done by a professional.

4. Trim trees

To avoid falling branches, you'll also want to be sure the trees closest to your house stay at a respectful distance. Have the trees on your property inspected and treated in the fall or early winter. Strong winds, ice, and heavy snow, and can weaken your trees. If they fall it could knock out electricity, satellite tv, or damage your home and vehicles.

5. Avoid bursting pipes

If the pipes inside and outside your home aren't properly insulated when temperatures drop below freezing, you can expect a busted pipe. To avoid this, allow a small trickle of cold water to run from your faucet. Take the time before winter to drain out outside faucets and disconnect and store hoses. When an outside faucet drips during freezing temperatures the water can turn to ice, which may cause the pipe to expand and break.

6. Protect your floors

If you have a wood or a stone floor, throw down a mat to protect against the winter sand and salt. Before you skimp on snow shoveling and go for the salt, be mindful salt can destroy flagstone entryways.


